VOLUNTEER RESPONDER INCENTIVE PROTECTION ACT

What does VRIPA do?

The Volunteer Responder Incentive Protection Act (VRIPA) allows communities to provide volunteer firefighters and EMS personnel with property tax reductions and/or up to \$600 per vear of recruitment and retention incentives without those benefits being subject to federal income tax and withholding.

Why do communities provide recruitment and retention incentives?

A volunteer firefighter in the United States donates services worth, on average, approximately \$18,000 per year to the department that he or she belongs to. We will never be able to make equipment that will take the place of the Fire Service knowing what they can and can't do AND requiring the discipline to stay within those limits. I.e. fire fighters always push the limits of the gear and put themselves in harm's way.

Thermal Protective Performance (TPP)

The Stoll Curve

Alice Stoll and Maria Chianta conducted burn injury research on "sailors, pigs and rats" in the late 1950s and early 1960s at the Aerospace Medical Research Department, Naval Air Development Center.

Sailors of the U.S. Navy volunteered to be burned on their forearms for a weekend pass.


Stoll and Chianta used heat exposures on human and animal skin to determine the level of heat energy that would create a second-degree burn.

For their work, they defined a second-degree burn as the point at which a blister forms. It became the Stoll Curve, which quantifies the level of heat and the duration of time required for TPP-Thermal Protective Performance

How much protection do we need?

correct amount of TPP and THL unit? Can it be decontaminated party laboratory (ex. Intertek or suming testing processes to verify both repairs and cleaning meets the current standards. Repairs to the outer shell, thermal liner and moisture barrier are subjected to a variety of laboratory tests to ensure the repairs being made at the repair facility meet or exceeds the construction standards of the NFPA 1971 (same standard for originally constructed gear). Repair facilities must submit to laboratory testing and spot inspection annually and maintain a stringent quality assurance program for their customers. Third party laboratory verification is the only recognized document available for performing advanced repairs and cleaning under NFPA 1851.

Isn't training from the manufacturer good enough to repair PPE?

No - some gear manufacturers train end user and repair facilities on the cleaning and inspection and very basic repair of personal protective ensemble. No manufacture can "certify " or verify any repair facility to the NFPA 1851 verification testing standards for advanced repairs. NFPA 1851 standard was written to specifically require third party laboratory testing in order to become a verified repair facility and standardize cleaning.


